Course Offerings and Requirements

Offered: June 23—30, 2012. Final projects due in mid-July.

Four (4) Credits: NSC 490/FW 491, section 701

Requirements: Interview, a one-page essay explaining your interest in the course, related learning goals, and camping or general outdoor experience. No experience necessary, just curiosity and an open heart.

Estimated Costs:

- Tuition/Fees (4 credits) @ student's current level
- Program Fee = \$475.00 to cover ferry, park fees and food costs.
- Additional personal cost—transportation to Grand Portage, Minnesota and some camping gear.
