## Monash University in Melbourne

### What's this program about?

Monash University is one of the "Group of Eight" - Australia's oldest universities and leaders in comprehensive general and professional education and research. Monash emphasizes holistic education in all fields. An example is their new double degrees, like the B.S. Commerce/B.S. Science; or the B.S. Science/B.S. Engineering. Even when enrolled for a single semester, students are allowed to enroll in a very broad and in-depth array of subjects. Monash prides itself in how it combines undergraduate training with faculty research. Laboratory and field experiences are integral to the undergraduate experience. The Clayton campus, opened in 1961, is a large park-like community in southeast Melbourne. Students live in residences with direct access to study resources and new friends. Monash offers more than 40 sporting clubs such as rugby, cricket, soccer and Aussie rules football. Swimming pools and other facilities are open to all students. The Campus Centre gives students a variety of restaurant options, book shop, optometrist, travel agent, pharmacy and more. Cultural venues include the Student Theatre, Museum of Art and the Monash Science Centre. Exciting weekend events and excursions are available through Monash Abroad.
