What's this program about?

The University of New South Wales (UNSW) allows students to enroll for a semester in regular Australian classes and is located in Sydney, the capital of New South Wales and the largest city in Australia. Wrapped around one of the world's finest harbors, the metropolis is a mosaic of countless international cultures and customs. The open and friendly feeling of the city is reflected in and around the UNSW campus. The university was established in 1949 as a school of technology and science. Today, it offers a full range of degree programs. The Business Faculty is the leading business school in the Asia/Pacific Rim region. In addition to technical and scientific skills, the Faculty of Engineering works to develop the creative and management skills that real world engineers need. Biological science, naturally, focuses on Australia's unique animals and plants. Health-related science can include genetics, anatomy, biomechanics or ergonomics, as well as laboratory courses, pharmacology, physics and chemistry. The Art and Social Sciences Faculty offer specialized courses as well interdisciplinary Australian studies, women's and gender studies, criminology or comparative development. The College of Fine Arts is located in Paddington, a trendy art gallery district 10 minutes by bus from main campus.
