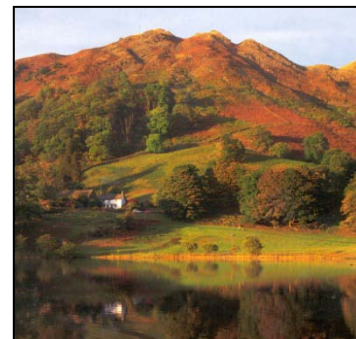

Semester available: Fall: 11 weeks (September through December); Spring: 25 weeks (January through July); Academic Year

NOTE TO SCIENCE MAJORS: Students majoring in the College of Natural Science are cautioned not to attend Lancaster during the fall semester as Lancaster's modular curriculum (11-week Michelmas) does not typically allow course content/structures that are equivalent to Michigan State University. Most equivalent course sequences require the full year at Lancaster or the 25-week spring semester.

Subjects offered: Full range of academic disciplines including accounting, American studies, art, biochemistry and molecular biology, biological science, business, chemistry, communication, computer science, criminal justice, economics, education, engineering, environmental science and policy, finance and insurance, French, geography, German, history, history of art, Italian, linguistics, management, mathematics, philosophy, physics, political science, psychology, religious studies, sociology, Spanish, statistics and probability, theatre, women's studies

Credits: Fall Semester: minimum of twelve (12); maximum of fifteen (15)
 Spring Semester: minimum of sixteen (16); maximum of twenty (20)

Requirements: MSU students only; 2.5 GPA; minimum sophomore status; essay

Costs: Program Fee: \$9,300 (SS11)
 Estimated additional costs: \$16,287, including tuition
